Focusing on garden ecology, the training will include support of school-based curriculum development and will also equip educators to plan and implement safe and effective outdoor lessons that provide students with hands-on experiences relative to their in-class curriculum. Course content is drawn from the City Parks Foundation *Learning Gardens* program for elementary and middle school youth. This program has served thousands of NYC public school students and assisted public schools to expand opportunities for students to learn science and for teachers to meet standards for over 20 years. ASPDP credit is optional.
